

THE GRAND VIEW: Community Policing News

When I offered to write this article I asked volunteers at GWCPC; why they volunteered and what their favourite thing is about volunteering. The responses weren't a surprise. Most said that they wanted to give back to the community, make their neighbourhood cleaner, safer, and more vibrant, make friends, meet like-minded people and more. What was surprising is how many noticed a change in themselves as they became more confident, more aware and worldly, happier, had a greater sense of belonging and purpose, more skills and social flexibility. There is strength in knowing that you are helping make your community and your world a better place. Volunteering has become a prerequisite for entry into more careers yet not a single individual admitted that they need volunteer hours to graduate from high school, enter some universities or that their volunteer hours will stand out on a resume. My son works for a Vancouver tech company which encourages each of its 1,000 employees to take a (paid) day off to volunteer. They want a workforce that is in touch with the real world. GWCPC has over 60 volunteers between ages 18 and 75. It is a very diverse, mostly young, population. Duties include regular community cleanups, graffiti paint-outs, and community outreach supporting all people in the neighbourhood. Volunteers staff the storefront office at 1977 Commercial, help people in crisis connect to services, record neighbourhood incidents of concern, register bicycles, monitor lost and found items, supply snacks and warm clothing to those in need, and much more. Volunteers participate in workshops and activities offered by VPD (crime prevention, security, etc.), ICBC (distracted driving, pedestrian safety, speed watch), Lotus Light Society (food distribution for persons needing a hand), etc. Interested? DID YOU KNOW?

In 2021 our volunteers helped register 214 bikes with Project 529 and did 12783 visual auto crime checks.

Since 2009 our volunteers have helped to clean 8411 blocks picking up 1631 drug paraphernalia, 1299 needles, 978 human waste items, along with other garbage that has added up to 3851 garbage bags. That's about 115, 530lbs of waste or the size of about 12 elephants!!!


