What is CPTED (pronounced sep-ted)? It is *Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design*, an approach to deterring criminal behaviour that focuses on how places are laid out and how they look and feel. If it's clean, appears lived in, cared for, it's less likely to attract undesirable behaviour.

The term CPTED has replaced "garbage pick-up" as volunteers learn of its importance to crime prevention. By making our community better looking, they're making it safer.

In November, they contributed over 100 volunteer hours, picked up over 250 pounds of litter, including 218 masks, 227 candy wrappers, over 700 cigarette butts. They also prevented street flooding by cleaning 160 catch basins of debris.

When weather permits, volunteers armed with paint, brushes and rollers cover graffiti. They clean leaves out of catch basins. They report discarded furniture and appliances to the City. The GWCPC uses and recommends VanConnect, a free app available to all residents to alert the City to issues. Graffiti seeds more graffiti and garbage seeds more garbage, so clean-up needs to be timely.

TARGET HARDEN YOUR HOME, YOUR BUSINESS, **YOUR COMMUNITY**

CPTED is an effective target hardening approach used for deterring criminal behaviour while reducing the impact criminal behaviour has on our communities. CPTED focuses on 4 main areas:

- Natural Surveillance Eliminates a criminal's 1) anonymity and increases opportunities for witnesses to observe criminal acts.
- Natural Access Control Create an environment 2) that ensures the entry to your property will assist in guiding legitimate visitors while deterring those looking to commit crime.
- Territorial Reinforcement Defined spaces 3) reinforce ownership of the property and can deter a person from negatively impacting or victimizing that environment.
- 4) Maintenance - Take ownership of your neighbourhood and conduct regular maintenance on your street with your neighbours.

Know that positive activities which foster community interaction discourage criminal and antisocial behaviour. To learn more about CPTED and our suggestions for each of the points above, please reach out to the GWCPC.


